



Broxbourne's Asian population was 2,190 (2.3% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 219 for Asian populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 234 in 2001.

- 10.4% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.5%).
- 5.1% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.7%).
- 11.4% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 15.5%).
- 14.5% of households overcrowded, (White British 8.1%).

Broxbourne's Black population was 3,957 (4.2% of its total) in 2011

Broxbourne's Minority population was 17,953 (19.2% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 89 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 164 in 2001

In 2011, the Minority population in Broxbourne had:

- 12.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.5%).
- 5.9% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.7%).
- 14.9% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 15.5%).
- 16.8% of households overcrowded, (White British 8.1%).

Broxbourne's Mixed population was 2,141 (2.3% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 107 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 99 in 2001

In 2011, the Mixed population in Broxbourne had:

- 11.5% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.5%).
- 7.5% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.7%).
- 19.1% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 15.5%).
- 18.8% of households overcrowded, (White British 8.1%).

Population

- Broxbourne has a population of 90,200 (8% of Herts population)

Age

- Broxbourne District has a population of 65+ of 14,900 people (9% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 16% of the total population of the district.
- Broxbourne's population 65+ is projected to increase by 17% by 2020 (lower than Hertfordshire average of 21%) and will make up 18%, of the total district population.

- Broxbourne has a population of 700 non-white retired people (8% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 4% of the total population (Herts average 4%)
- 10% of older people in Broxbourne live in areas where older people experience deprivation live. This represents 21% of the older population of Broxbourne.

Ethnicity and Migration

Dacorum's Asian population was 6,770 (4.7% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 76 for Asian populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 102 in 2001

In 2011, the Asian population in Dacorum had:

- 8.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.4%).
- 5.1% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.0%).
- 14.4% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.8%).
- 16.9% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.3%).

Dacorum's Black population was 2,990 (2.1% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 119 for Black populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 98 in 2001

In 2011, the Black population in Dacorum had:

- 8.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.4%).
- 9.3% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.0%).
- 11.6% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.8%).
- 17.3% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.3%).

Dacorum's Minority population was 20,310 (14.0% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 152 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 147 in 2001.

In 2011, the Minority population in Dacorum had:

- 10.2% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.4%).
- 5.5% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.0%).
- 13.8% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.8%).
- 13.4% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.3%).

Dacorum's Mixed population was 3,075 (2.1% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 186 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 110 in 2001

In 2011, the Mixed population in Dacorum had:

- 11.7% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.4%).
- 6.9% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.0%).
- 18.6% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.8%).
- 10.3% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.3%).

Population

- Dacorum has the largest population in the county 141,600 people (13% of Herts population)

Age

- Dacorum has the highest population of 65+ in the county - 22,700 people (13% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 16% of the total population of the district.
- Dacorum's population 65+ is projected to increase by 22% by 2020 (higher than Hertfordshire average of 21%) and will make up 19%, of the total district population.
- Dacorum has a population of 800 non-white retired people (9.3% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 3% of the total population (Herts average 4%)
- Dacorum has the highest proportion (14%) of retired people living in areas where older people experience deprivation. This represents 19% of the older population of Dacorum.

Ethnicity and Migration

- Dacorum has 13,600 Non-white people (10%) representing 10% of the total district population (increase from 4.55% in 2001), which is lower than the Herts average (12%)

East Hertfordshire's Black population was 984 (0.7% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 78 for Black populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 81 in 2001

In 2011, the Black population in East Hertfordshire had:

- 9.7% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 9.7%).
- 8.8% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.1%).
- 10.9% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 13.4%).
- 18.0% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.4%).

East Hertfordshire's Minority population was 13,421 (9.7% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 307 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 247 in 2001

In 2011, the Minority population in East Hertfordshire had:

- 7.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 9.7%).
- 3.7% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.1%).
- 11.1% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 13.4%).
- 14.3% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.4%).

East Hertfordshire's Mixed population was 2,214 (1.6% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 247 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 229 in 2001

In 2011, the Mixed population in East Hertfordshire had:

- 8.7% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 9.7%).
- 4.4% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.1%).
- 16.3% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 13.4%).
- 13.0% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.4%).

Population

- East Hertfordshire has the third largest population in the county 137,100 people (12% of Herts population)

Age

- East Herts has the third highest population of 65+ in the county - 21,000 people (12% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 15% of the total population of the district.
- East Hertfordshire's population 65+ is projected to increase by 30% by 2020 (this is the highest increase in the county) and will make up 19%, of the total district population
- East Hertfordshire has the second lowest population of non-white retired people in the county - 600 people (7% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 2% of the total population of retired people the district (Herts average 4%)
- East Herts has the second lowest proportion (8%) of retired people living in areas where older people experience deprivation. This represents 11% of the older population of East Herts.

Ethnicity and Migration

- East Hertfordshire has the third lowest population (9%) of Non-white people - 11,500, representing 8% of the total district population (increase from 2.89% in 2001), which is lower than the Herts average (12%)
- The largest non-white ethnic group are Asian Indian (1.8%), followed by African (1.1%) and Pakistani (0.9%).
- However 4.7% of the population are from 'White Other' (ie not British or Irish) ethnic groups, increase from 2.66% in 2001, and NI registrations indicate show that biggest group of migrant workers in 2010 originate from Poland, followed by Spain.

Hertsmere's Asian population was 7,393 (7.4% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 262 for Asian populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 269 in 2001

Hertsmere's Minority population was 24,281 (24.3% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 283 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 260 in 2001

In 2011, the Minority population in Hertsmere had:

- 8.6% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.0%).
- 5.1% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.1%).
- 12.6% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 15.1%).
- 15.5% of households overcrowded, (White British 6.3%).

Hertsmere's Mixed population was 2,619 (2.6% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 198 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 240 in 2001

In 2011, the Mixed population in Hertsmere had:

- 9.2% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.0%).
- 7.7% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 4.1%).
- 15.6% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 15.1%).
- 17.3% of households overcrowded, (White British 6.3%).

- Hertsmere has a population of 98,900 (9% of Herts population)

Age

- Hertsmere District has a population of 65+ of 16,100 people (9% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 16% of the total population of the district.
- Hertsmere's population 65+ is projected to increase by 24% by 2020 (this is the third highest increase in the county) and will make up 18%, of the total district population.
- Hertsmere has one of the highest population of non-white retired people in the county - 1,100 people (12.8% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 6% of the total population of retired people the district (Herts average 4%).
- 12% of older people in Hertsmere live in areas where older people experience deprivation live. This represents 23% of the older population of Hertsmere.

Ethnicity and Migration

North Hertfordshire's Black population was 2,491 (2.0% of its total) in 2011

North Hertfordshire's Minority population was 19,225 (15.1% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 149 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 117 in 2001

In 2011, the Minority population in North Hertfordshire had;

- 9.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 9.8%).
- 5.3% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.6%).
- 14.2% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.6%).

North Hertfordshire's Mixed population was 3,376 (2.7% of its total) in 2011

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 187 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 57 in 2001

In 2011, the Mixed population in North Hertfordshire had:

- 11.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 9.8%).
- 5.0% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.6%).

- North Hertfordshire has a population of 124,700 (11.4% of Herts population)

- North Hertfordshire's population 65+ is projected to increase by 28% by 2020 (this is the second highest increase in the county) and will make up 20% of the total district population
- North Hertfordshire has a population of 1,000 non-white retired people (11.6% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 4% of the total population (Herts average 4%)
- North Herts has one of the second highest proportions (12%) of retired people living in areas where older people experience deprivation. This represents 17% of the older population of North Herts.

Ethnicity and Migration

St Albans's Black population was 2,388 (1.7% of its total) in 2011.

- 8.8% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 8.2%).

St Albans's Minority population was 26,519 (18.9% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 64 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 64 in 2001

- 8.3% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 8.2%).

St Albans's Mixed population was 3,904 (2.8% of its total) in 2011.

- St Albans has the second largest population in the county 137,200 people (12% of Herts population)

- St. Albans District has a population of 65+ of 20,600 people (12% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 15% of the total population of the district.
- St Albans population 65+ is projected to increase by 17% by 2020 (lower than Hertfordshire average of 21%) and will make up 16%, of the total district population
- St Albans has a population of 1,000 non-white retired people (11.6% of non white retired people in the county) representing 4% of the total population (Herts average 4%)
- St Albans has one of the lowest proportions (6%) of retired people living in areas where older people experience deprivation. This represents 9% of the older population of St Albans.

Ethnicity and Migration

- St Albans has the second largest population (13%) of Non-white people in the county - 15,800 people representing 12% of the total district population (increase from 6.9% in 2001), which is the same the Herts average (12%)

Stevenage's Black population was 2,836 (3.4% of its total) in 2011.

Stevenage's Minority population was 14,176 (16.9% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 331 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 216 in 2001.

- 10.2% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 11.7%).
- 6.4% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 5.4%).
- 13.8% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 17.3%).
- 13.6% of households overcrowded, (White British 6.9%).

Stevenage's Mixed population was 2,265 (2.7% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 262 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 131 in 2001.

In 2011, the Mixed population in Stevenage had:

- 12.4% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 11.7%).
- 8.9% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 5.4%).
- 18.2% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 17.3%).

- Stevenage has the smallest population in the county 81,000 people (7% of Herts population)

Age

- Stevenage has the second lowest population of 65+ in the county - 11,700 people (7% of over 65 population for Hertfordshire) representing 14% of the total population of the district.
- Stevenage's population 65+ is projected to increase by 16% by 2020 (the second lowest increase in the county) and will make up 16%, of the total district population.
- Stevenage has the lowest population of non-white retired people in the county - 500 people (5.8% of non-white retired people in the county) representing 4% of the total population of retired people the district (Herts average 4%).
- Stevenage has one of the second highest proportions (12%) of retired people living in areas where older people experience deprivation. This represents 32% of the older population of Stevenage.

Ethnicity and Migration

- Stevenage has the lowest population of (6%) Non-white people - 7,800 representing 10% of the total district population (increase from 5.42% in 2001), which is lower than the Herts average (12%)
- The largest non-white ethnic group are Asian Indian (1.5%), followed by African (1.4%) and Pakistani (1.1%).
- However 4% of the population are from 'White Other' (ie not British or Irish) ethnic groups, increase from 1.44% in 2001, and NI registrations indicate show that biggest group of migrant workers in 2010 originate from Poland, followed by India.

Three Rivers Asian population was 7,993 (9.2% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 273 for Asian populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 291 in 2001.

In 2011, the Asian population in Three Rivers had:

- 6.3% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.2%).
- 4.0% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.3%).
- 11.1% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.4%).
- 6.6% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.7%).

Three Rivers's Black population was 1,610 (1.8% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 94 for Black populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 127 in 2001.

In 2011, the Black population in Three Rivers had:

- 10.7% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.2%).
- 7.5% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.3%).
- 12.5% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.4%).
- 16.3% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.7%).

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 338 for Minority populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 338 in 2001.

In 2011, the Minority population in Three Rivers had:

- 7.9% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.2%).
- 4.1% unemployed among adults aged 25 and older, (White British 3.3%).
- 12.0% long term limiting illness rate, (White British 14.4%).
- 9.2% of households overcrowded, (White British 5.7%).

Three Rivers's Mixed population was 2,002 (2.3% of its total) in 2011.

Its Index of Multiple Inequality ranked 226 for Mixed populations among the 348 districts of England & Wales (1=worst). It ranked 109 in 2001.

In 2011, the Mixed population in Three Rivers had:

- 8.3% of 16-24 year olds with no qualifications, (White British 10.2%).

- However 5.5% of the population are from 'White Other' (ie not British or Irish) ethnic groups, increase from 3.12% in 2001, and NI registrations indicate show that biggest group of migrant workers in 2010 originate from India, followed by Nigeria. However anecdotal evidence suggests there are at least 4,000 Polish residents in the borough.
